It included a new kitchen, which Houlton generously funded to the tune of more than £10,000 through the YORhub YOR4Good fund scheme – a construction framework used by local authorities and organisations in the Yorkshire region.

ENVIRONMENT: 2020

Houlton's Yard Re-Cycling Facility

- Our Headquarters Yard waste re-cycling continued to achieve 100% re-cycled in 2020 on target for the year.
- Greater roll-out of MS Teams and Zoom software across the business to allow working from home and also avoiding meetings in the office or on sites due to COVID-19 impact. Continued investment in new more energy efficient MFP printers and laser site and office printers, new laptops and PC's, etc.. Increased use of tablets on site to minimise paper and electronic distribution of drawings for similar efficiencies. Continued to recycle any redundant ICT equipment with local refurbishment company.
- We continued to monitor waste streams from our construction projects. 15 live sites monitored in 2020 which diverted 98% of site waste by volume from landfill.



• Houlton continues to adopt the principles of the Considerate Constructors Scheme to minimise the impact of activity in relation to a site's immediate surroundings, particularly with regard to noise, dust, litter, mud, transportation and parking. Performance Beyond Compliance certificates achieved by our site teams for Kelvin Hall School and St. Mary's College for Esteem in Hull and for Bellows Road Housing project for Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council.

• We continued to promote the use of materials with a high recycled content on site where appropriate and timber from certified sustainably managed sources.

• Improved biodiversity on sites including installing permanent or

temporary ecology features where appropriate.

- Pollution prevention planning on sites ensured zero pollution incidents caused in 2020.
- Replacement of a further 5 company vans during the year with newer more efficient engines - with an average 15% CO² reduction for the new vehicles - a significant 5% improvement over 2019.

- Complete training as identified in the company Training Plan developed from employee appraisals.
- To develop our sub-contractor competency process and support and educate regarding their own CSR policy.
